Learning Aims and Curriculum Intent:

Year 10 is about pupils continuing to acquire new language by studying new topics or diving deeper in to topics previously met at KS3. There is also a focus on developing the skills required to thrive in the assessment style of the iGCSE. We continue to work to build spontaneity and confidence when speaking, as well as encouraging pupils to broaden their range of language, using their skills to apply language learnt in different contexts and to different topics.

Revision skills

Speaking – be able to answer questions on all topics in a conversation with the teacher. Describe a picture and hypothesise about what happened before or after it.

Reading and listening – in exam conditions, be able to recognise, respond to and recall vocabulary from all topics covered over the year in a GCSE format end of year exam.

Writing – Be able to apply knowledge of vocabulary and grammar to write a longer piece from a choice of three about topics covered through the year.

Grammar – in exam conditions, complete an exam style gap fill exercise, completing verbs and adjective forms.

Retrieval quizzes, using Quizlet, language gym, vocabulary tests and similar.

Low stakes test to ensure grammar and vocabulary has been consolidated

End of year exam, testing all four skills and covering all topics, grammar and vocabulary worked on throughout the year, mirroring the GCSE exam format.

Examples of Homework	Vocabulary learning, grammar workbook practice and consolidation, reading, writing and grammar tasks, speaking preparation.		
Key terminology	All students are issued with the Hodder iGCSE German textbook and grammar workbook, and a comprehensive list of vocabulary is available at the end of each chapter. Quizlet links for the GCSE minimum core vocabulary and the vocabulary covered in the textbooks are also provided to pupils. Infinitive, conjugate, decline, agreement, subject pronoun, verb, noun, article, adjective, present/perfect/imperfect/future/conditional tense.		
Super-curricular enrichment and scholarly extension	Read: Find out about Germany as a country, its culture and some of its history, in English of German, either online or in print, to get a deeper cultural understanding of the German speaking world. Watch and listen: The Onatti theatre group play which will be performed at some point during the school year. The library has an excellent selection of German films that can be borrowed and watched with German or English subtitles. Many of these are also on Planet eStream. Watch the slowly spoken news in German (link below) and follow the text, to help build comprehension skills and confidence. Visit: The library, to look at some basic reading material Consider a trip to a German speaking country to see the language used in situ and build confidence in speaking. Download the Duolingo app and use it to practise and consolidate vocabulary. Complete independent work on language nut or quizlet.
