1 Introduction

- 1.1 Forest is a workplace setting and although there are different definitions of this term, the starting point is that we consider this is a professional environment. The uniform represents the School and we encourage pupils to be proud of how they present themselves. We promote inclusivity in our School Uniform by ensuring pupils feel comfortable in the choices of uniform items available. Whilst we recognise pupils are wearing the same uniform, we want to ensure they continue to feel content in what they are wearing. At Forest, pupils can wear the skirt or the trouser uniform between the Years 7-11. A distinct uniform applies to those pupils in the Sixth Form.
- 1.2 School uniform must be always worn during the school day or when representing the school, unless specific permission is given, or an alternative activity is taking place. All uniform items should be clearly marked with the pupil's full name. This includes other personal items used in School such as devices, musical instrument cases and sporting equipment etc. Uniform should be clean, smart and in presentable condition.
- 1.3 Please note all items are compulsory unless clearly stated below.
- 1.4 Forest has adopted the Halo Code. Further information can be <u>found here</u>. Schools have the right to enforce a dress code as long as it is fair and does not unduly discriminate against any students and staff. Under the Public Sector Equality Duty (PSED), "schools must eliminate racial discrimination and promote good race relations". At Forest, we recognise and celebrate our staff and pupils' identities. Our school champions the right of staff and pupils to embrace all Afro-hairstyles. We are a community built on an ethos of equality and respect where hair texture and style have no bearing on anyone's ability to succeed. Also linking to our School values of Diversity and Community. We welcome Afro-textured hair worn in all styles including the wearing of durags or wraps which are worn with respect to protective hairstyles, if worn these should be black or navy.
- 1.5 If extreme weather conditions require the Uniform Policy to be temporarily adapted, the Pastoral Leadership Team will communicate any necessary amendments to the Forest Community.
- 1.6 If pupils do not have the correct uniform or are not following the below expectations sanctions will be issued. Pupils will always receive a professional conversation as a first offence. Please see the Behaviour Policy for further information. If there are extenuating circumstances regarding pupils not having the correct uniform parents/carers should inform the tutor in the first instance.

2.5 In addition to the above please note:

- 2.5.1 Pupils in the Sixth Form can wear the Forest School Games/PE kit if they wish, or they can wear their own sportswear. This should be suitable for the activity they are participating in. In addition, Year 13 pupils' can wear their leavers hoodies once they are given to them.
- 2.5.2 We want Sixth Form to have the freedom to express their individual personality, but we expect Sixth Form pupils also to understand the need to do so within the culture of a particular institution or organisation. As a pupil of Forest School, the overall impression they create must be of a professional person. They must be dressed in formal attire.
- 2.5.3 House hoodies can be worn for House Events (only).
- 2.5.4 If a Year 7-11 pupil is participating in a physical activity during their activities programme they should wear their PE/Games kit unless the teacher or activity requires specific clothing.
- 2.5.5 All shirts worn must be tucked in, ties properly tied.
- 2.5.6 Senior pupils are allowed to leave the school site in the full Forest Tracksuit if they have sporting activities and games after lunch. This is also applied to School Fixtures.
- 2.5.7 Smart watches are allowed to be worn but will not be allowed to be worn in an exam setting. If smart watches are used incorrectly and used in the similar way to a phone in terms of communication the Behaviour Policy would be activated.
- 2.5.8 We invite and welcome conversations with pupils regarding articles of clothing relating to the faith, this will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
- 2.5.9 All pupils should wear their tracksuit bottoms when eating in the Dining Hall.

3 Senior Sports Teams (Years 11-13)

- 3.1 In addition to the uniform items noted above Senior Sports teamwear can be purchased directly through the Sports Department and must be worn when representing the School teams.
- 3.2 Pupils in Years 12 and 13 taking part in other areas of physical activity are requested to wear appropriate sportswear suitable to the activity or sport they are taking part in.

4 Non-School Uniform Days

4.1 There may be days in the academic year where pupils can wear non-school uniform. These days are usually where the School community comes together to raise money for worthy causes. At Forest we want to foster an atmosphere where pupils can express their individuality, but pupils must understand we are still in a professional environment. Pupils must ensure their chosen clothes are suitable for a workplace setting.

5 Representing the School

5.1 There may be days in the academic year where pupils will be representing the School in external events, fixtures, performances, Open Days etc. It is important pupils still follow the same expectations to Uniform as they would do if it was a normal school day. If pupils are asked to wear School Uniform or Sports attire this should be worn correctly as noted above.

6 Uniform in School Communications

6.1 Please note that images and videos are taken at many School events to be used for internal and external communications and to celebrate the pupils' achievements. Pupils should be mindful that they are representing the School at all times when they are in uniform and should ensure that the uniform policy is adhered to.
