## French

## Learning Aims and Curriculum Intent:

Year 13 is the second year of the Edexcel A-level French course. Pupils will continue to build on skills and grammar from the first year of the course but will acquire new language skills and cultural knowledge on two new Topic Areas – The Occupation and the Resistance, and Immigration in France. Students will also complete an in-depth film study of La Haine and will acquire new vocabulary related to the analysis of cinematic technique. Students will develop their listening and reading comprehension skills and will acquire a vast amount of new vocabulary. In Year 13, we intend to build students' confidence with speaking, particularly working on developing spontaneity in spoken responses. Students will be able to apply their linguistic skills in French to a variety of contexts and topics and will also complete their own independent research project on an aspect of culture, history or politics in Francophone society which interests them and will prepare this for their final oral exam. Students will develop a deep understanding of French culture, society and history and will become passionate Francophiles over the course of their studies.

Key terminology	All students will be issued with the Edexcel A-Level text-book with vocabulary lists per topic, Mot à Mot for extensive vocabulary lists relevant to all topics and literature/film analysis, Hodder Study Guide for La Haine and Edexcel grammar and translation workbooks.		
Super-curricular enrichment and scholarly extension	Read: French newspapers such as Le Monde, Le Figaro and Libération. Any French literature from recommended lists provided by AJG or in the library.  Watch: There are lots of French-language Netflix series and films, as well as the extensive collection of French language films available in the school library  Listen: There are numerous appropriate French language podcasts – ask AJG for recommendations based on your interests.  Visit: L'Institut Francais (London). Also consider a trip to France to practise your language skills. Check out exhibitions in London galleries and museums. Or take part in Language taster days or study days orga by London universities. Or compete in translation competitions run by Oxford University.
