

## Learning Aims and Curriculum Intent:

In Year 9 we intend to instil in all our students a passion for French that helps them develop the skills and confidence to belong in a multicultural world. We aim to ensure that all students understand and respond to spoken and written language from a variety of sources, speak with increasing confidence finding ways of communicating what they want to say using a variety of grammatical structures. We aspire to give our pupils a real taste of Francophone culture, which will bring language learning to life, and to establish excellent French pronunciation and spelling. We also build grammatical knowledge in Year 9, developing skills with the perfect, imperfect, and future tenses, giving students the tools to communicate about past and future events.
